## Six Steps to Become a CASA Hero of Hope



#### Step 1: Live Info Session

Attend a 1-hour information session. Learn about the role, responsiblities, requirements, and experiences of current volunteers.



#### Step 2: Apply

Complete an online application.





Attend a 1-hour Zoom meeting. Tell us more about yourself and share why you're interested in volunteering. We ensure the volunteers who work with our kids are there for the right reasons, and we take that very seriously.

#### Step 4: CASA Academy



Our CASA Academy is a 2-week course that prepares you to be a successful advocate for a child. This consists of in-person and online training.

#### **Step 5: Graduation**



Congratulations! You've completed pre-service training and will be sworn in officially as a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) by a judge in the dependency system.

#### **Step 6: Meet Your Advocate Coordinator**



After graduation, you'll be assigned to an Advocate Coordinator who will work closely with you on your child's case, offer resources, and provide support throughout your CASA service.
